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# Preparation

*“I would not say that the future is necessarily less predictable than the past. I think the past was not predictable when it started”*

- Can we ever be prepared enough?
- Plans are designed, discussed, redesigned, reinforced, even practiced
- Can we be over-prepared?
- No matter how good and well practiced the plan, when the unexpected happens, it is unexpected
- Decisions will need to be made “on the fly”
- The best preparation for this is to be informed
- A WARP would ensure that everybody was informed



- Large organisations invest heavily in security protection
  - e.g. Atos Origin have the experience of dealing with attacks on the Olympic IT Infrastructure
- Smaller organisations may not
- Sharing of information across all involved organisations will encourage best practice

- Here!
  - 2012 Workshop at WARP Annual Forum
- The infrastructure is in place for an Olympic WARP



- Olympic WARP will not happen without official recognition
- Need to have something in place by end of year (2009)



- **1<sup>st</sup> Place**
  - Olympics free of Information Security incidents across all participants
- **2<sup>nd</sup> Place**
  - establishing a collaborative network that may continue beyond 2012 to support other sporting events / large scale gatherings
- **Last place**
  - Olympics affected by a compromise of a supplier's system
  - Only the large contractors benefit from experiences which are not shared
